- 2. No person to advance les the 1s; above five pounds, 2s. 6d.; and so in in proportions
- 3. In the case of lots upon which there is a reserve, the Auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller.
- 4. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 10s. in the pound, if required, in part payment of the purchase-money; in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and resold.
